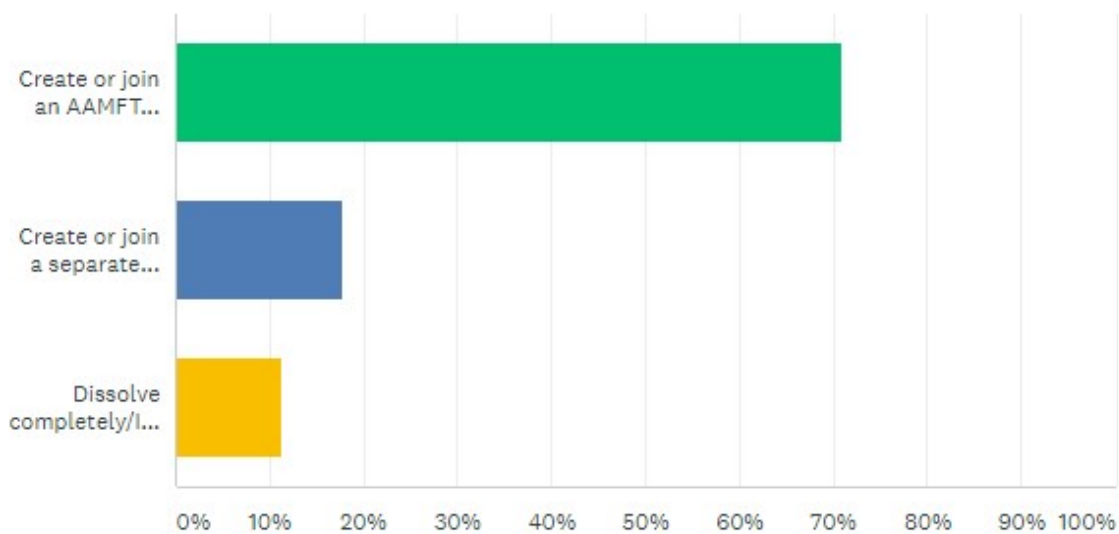


OAMFT member survey 2017

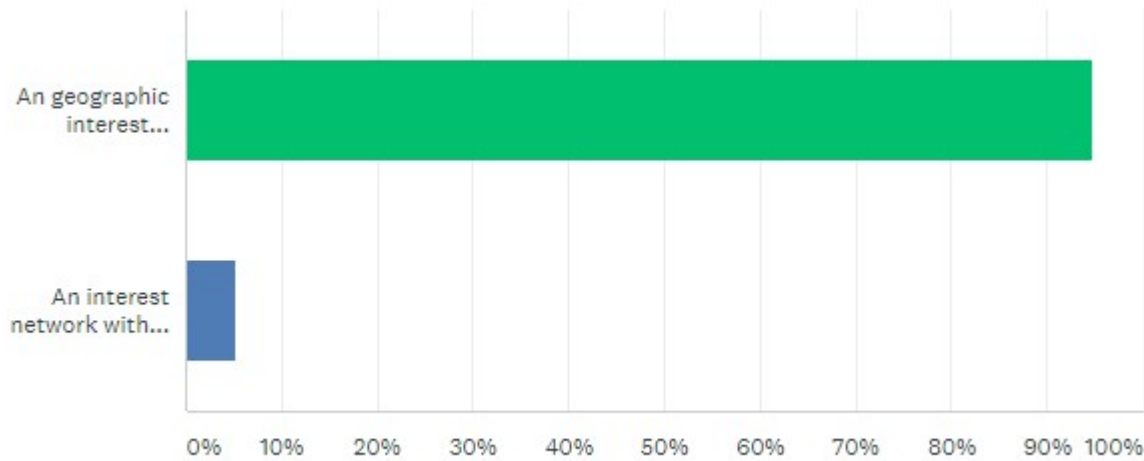

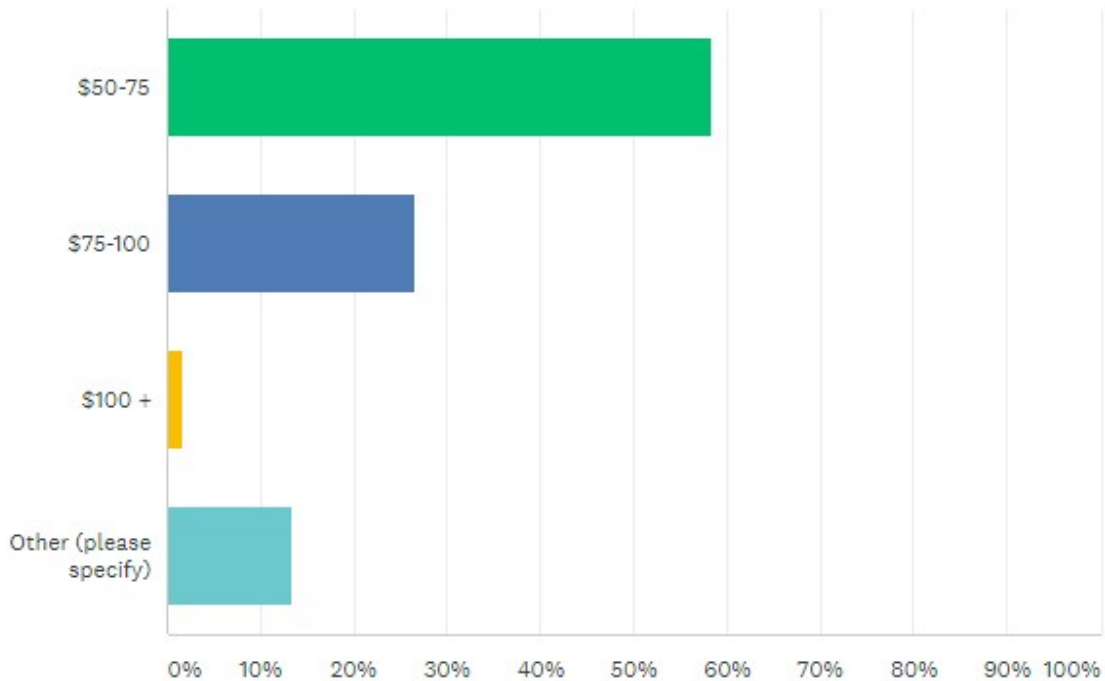

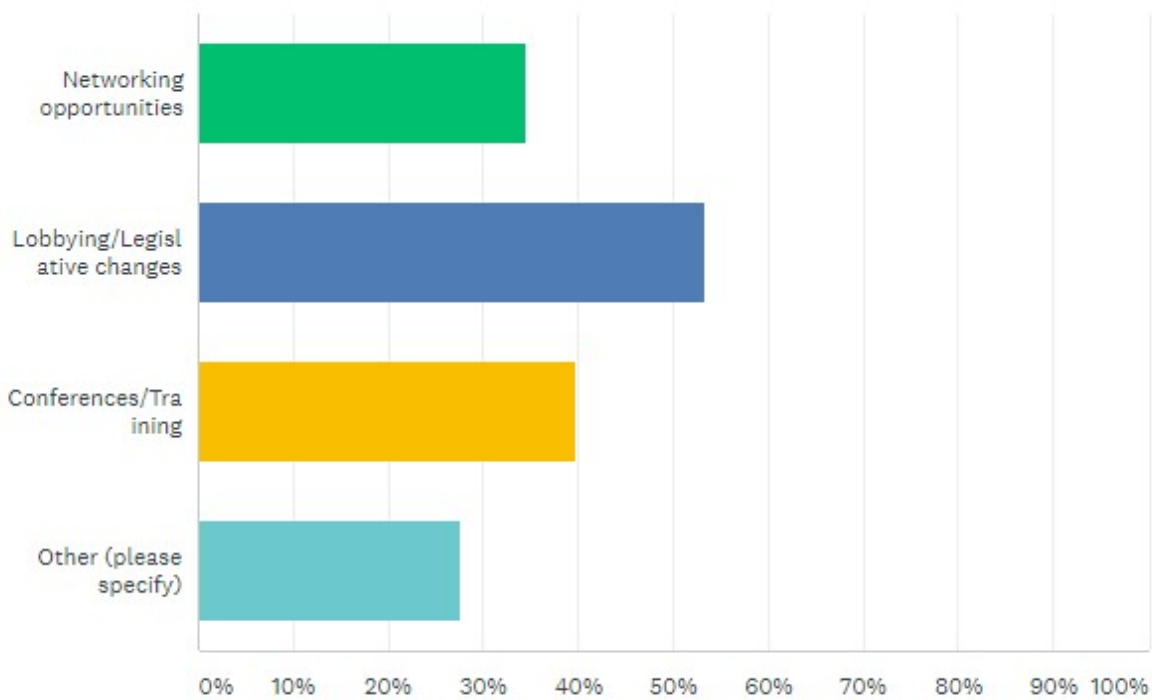

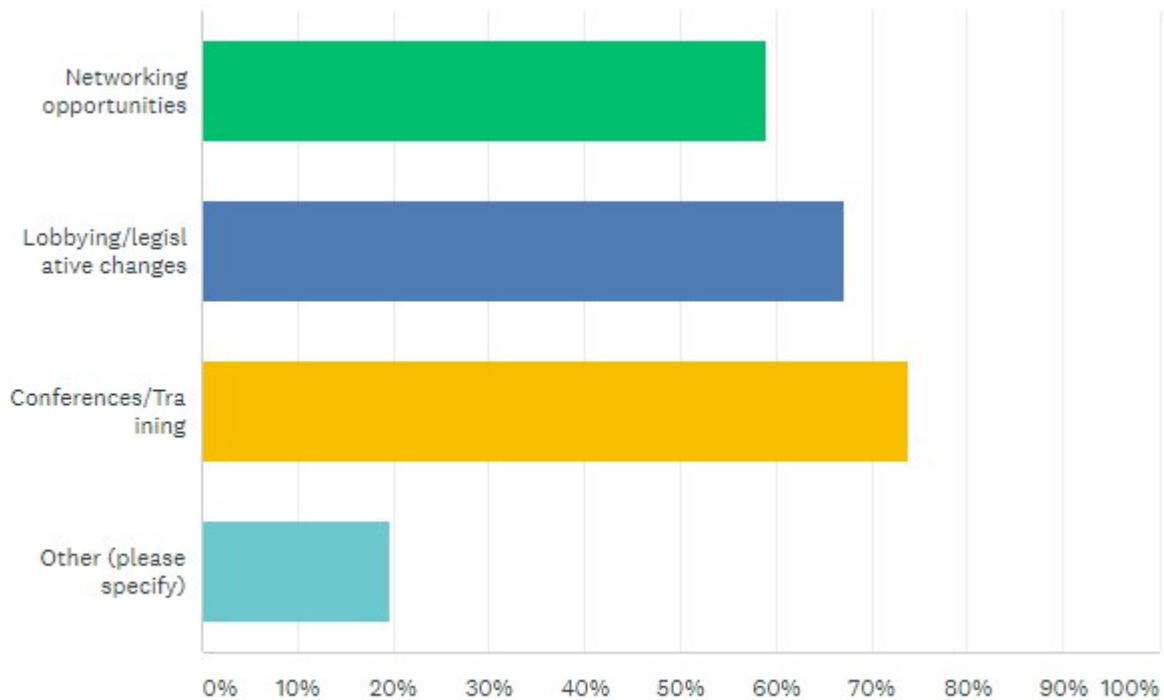
